Upcoming Events

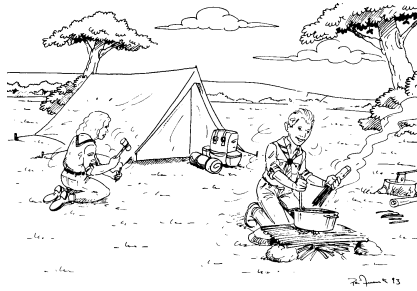

Camp Cooking Corner

In this section we will offer recipes that we have cooked at campouts. If you have any that you would like to share please pass them along. The first will be from the Family Camp in April '07.

Banana Nut Bread

1. Warm a 10" Dutch oven
2. Mix 2 packages of Banana Nut bread according to directions. Add 1 egg, 2 Tbs cin-
3. namon, 2 Tbs sugar.
3. Pour mix into the Dutch oven
4. Cut 1/2 stick of butter into Dutch oven.
5. Reinstall lid and place 9 — 11 briquettes on top and 3 — 4 on bottom. Rotate oven and lid every 15 minutes.
6. Cook 1:15 to 1:30 until a golden brown crust forms on top and bread is done through all layers.
7. Makes 8 to 12 servings
